## Report on the Dental Team Visit 26 April - 3 May 2014

#### **Dental Volunteers**

Due to uncertainty regarding the registration or otherwise within Nepal of volunteers as advised by the Community Health Development Society (CHDS), a very small team travelled to Nepal this time.

The actual visit extended to 8 May. The second week was devoted to working on the Village Development Program - Sanitation in Arubot and Dandagaun, and planning for the future direction of the various programs.

Over the past 10 years dental services in the upper Kathmandu valley have increased considerably. Nepal now has more than 10 dental colleges producing dentists (none in existence 10 years ago), plus overall living and economic conditions have improved. While there will always be poor and marginalised people in this region, they at least have some access to emergency care. Our future plan, under consideration over the next six months, is to move the Dental and Sanitation projects to other regions where access to services is difficult.
